

LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading: 2 Sm 1:1-4, 11-12, 19, 23-27

David returned from his defeat of the Amalekites and spent two days in Ziklag.

On the third day a man came from Saul's camp, with his clothes torn and dirt on his head.

Going to David, he fell to the ground in homage.

David asked him, "Where do you come from?"

He replied, "I have escaped from the camp of the children of Israel."

"Tell me what happened," David bade him.

He answered that many of the soldiers had fled the battle and that many of them had fallen and were dead, among them Saul and his son Jonathan.
